20th – 28th September 2019 International Psychoanalytic University Berlin







The summer school "Social Trauma in Changing Societies" (20th – 28th September 2019, International Psychoanalytic University, Berlin) is part of a research and teaching network that connects IPU with universities from Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Greece, Serbia and Turkey since 2012. It is funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) under the East-West-Dialogue programme.

For the first time, the network invites students from all over the world to meet and discuss with international scholars from several disciplines involved in the topic of social trauma: Psychology, Psychoanalysis, Cultural Studies, Sociology and Political Studies.

The programme of the summer school includes:

- Keynote lectures, presenting different inputs from psychoanalysis, psychology, cultural studies and political science on the general concept of social trauma
- Public panels and a fishbowl session, where keynote lecturers discuss their approaches
- Seminars, deepening the input perspectives and connecting them to an interdisciplinary course on social trauma (CST), encompassing the subjects of clinical, developmental, general and social psychology, ethics and research methodology.
- Film screening and analysis
- Student research supervisions
- Student reflection groups
- Social and cultural activities for students
